

MOAA BASE/POST SCHOLARSHIP

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

The Military Officer Association of America (MOAA) will award 25 grants of \$1,000 each for the 2009-2010 school year.

ELIGIBILITY:

An applicant must be the DEPENDENT CHILD of an ACTIVE DUTY member or a DRILLING Reserve/National Guard member, officer or enlisted, of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, Coast Guard, United States Public Health Service (USPHS), or National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA).

An applicant must be a high school senior or college student who will be working on his or her first undergraduate degree during the 2009-2010 school year, and under the age of 24.

An applicant must be planning to attend an accredited college or university as a full-time student in the fall of 2009.

SELECTION:

Scholarship winners will be randomly selected from applicants, with representation given to each of the uniformed services, including Reserves and National Guard. An applicant's uniformed-service sponsor does not have to be a member of MOAA.

APPLICATION:

Applications can only be made ONLINE, beginning November 1, 2008. Go to MOAA's website: <http://www.moaa.org/education>. There is one online application for all programs.

DEADLINE for on-line entry is noon EST March 2, 2009 —NO EXCEPTIONS.

If chosen as a semi-finalist in late March, the applicant will be able to check their status online in late March as well as being notified by letter & email. He/she must then send copies of both the applicant's military ID card and the sponsor's military ID card to: MOAA, Base/Post Scholarship, 201 N. Washington St., Alexandria, VA 22314-2311.
