

Colorado's 138th Space Control Squadron pioneers new training

The Colorado Air National Guard's 138th Space Control Squadron, in conjunction with the National Space Test and Training Complex, conducted a training event named "Neptune Falcon," which took place at Schriever Space Force Base, Colorado Springs, Colorado, to test new capabilities for meeting wartime objectives in the space domain.

The exercise, held over 10 days in October 2022 at a newly created forward operating base by Airmen of the 138th, simulated real-world expeditionary operations and prepared them for upcoming deployments.

"This is a Secretary of Defense level joint interoperability exercise that includes aircraft from Air Combat Command, space participants from the 138th Space Control Squadron, Colorado Air National Guard, and the 25th Space Range Squadron, as well as a host of other participants," U.S. Air Force Lt. Col. Andy Gold, commander, 138th SPCS, said.

There have been many significant milestones that the 138th SPCS has led along the way, according to Gold.

"This is the first time a U.S. Air Force or Air National Guard weapons system has ever connected to the

Range Closed Loop Environment," Maj. Matthew Thampy, assistant director of operations, 25th Space Range Squadron, said. "The RCLE provides a highly realistic electronic warfare system to train and test our systems."

This is also the first time the RCLE has been requested by a combatant command to support a joint interoperability exercise, such as Neptune Falcon. Additionally, this marks the first Total Force event (integration of Active Duty and Reserve forces) in which the combatant command and Air National Guard unit employed the RCLE, paving the way for future support for the broader Department of Defense need of realistic, dynamic environments to support the warfighter.

"During this exercise, we are training to deal with crew dynamics, tactics, techniques, and procedures, as well as getting hands-on system time," U.S. Air Force Airman 1st Class Lindsey Sequoia, 138th SPCS space control operator, and Neptune Falcon participant, said. "Getting that practice on how to respond in a real-world scenario is invaluable to me."

Neptune Falcon also signifies a key Total Force Integration partnership for future training and test events involving the National Guard Bureau, Space Operations Command, and Space Training and Readiness Command.

"Events like this also meet key U.S. Air Force and U.S. Space Force directives for highly realistic training events/ scenarios in preparing Guardians, Airmen for war," Thampy said.

The 138th SPCS stood up in May 2019 and has rapidly improved the training environment to create the most realistic wartime scenarios possible, preparing space professionals for future wartime missions. Forward Operating Base Schriever is the latest iteration of technological advances in training for the members, which creates a superior training environment never before experienced by Air National Guard or Active-Duty space warriors.

First Lady recognizes Colorado National Guard member's child at White House

As part of her Joining Forces initiative to support military families, First Lady Jill Biden joined National Guard families and state adjutants general for a roundtable discussion on support for National Guard children at the White House Roosevelt Room, Washington, D.C., Nov. 28, 2022.

Representing Colorado military kids, Shaun Gurtner, 14, son of U.S. Air Force Master Sgt. Kaisha Gurtner Hatton, inspection coordinator, 140th Wing Inspector General, Colorado Air National Guard joined Biden for the discussion.

"For many Americans, our National Guard and their families are the only service members that civilians might know." Biden said. "Because our Guard members may not wear a uniform every day—because you don't live on or near military bases—sometimes neighbors, teachers, and other students, don't realize your connection. That's why it's important for us to tell your stories through our Joining Forces initiative—and why I continue to meet with and learn from military kids just like you as First Lady."

"This was a once in a lifetime opportunity for my family to represent National Guard families from Colorado," Gurtner said. "As a family that has deployed overseas five times in the last decade it's important for us to share our stories to help strengthen communities and policies that better support the National Guard and their families."

This White House initiative, which the National Guard Bureau implements through states and territories, supports military families at the community level.

Colorado Joining Community Forces works alongside the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs to present a single-entry point for resources and service providers interested in collaborating with other national and local civic-minded entities with a focus to connect community organizations that assist veterans, service members, and their families.

Resources are available for education, emergency assistance, employment, family and youth support, health and wellness, housing, legal assistance, and financial assistance.

Ultimately, Colorado JCF endeavors to strengthen pre-existing inter-service family assistance centers across the U.S. through a comprehensive strategic communications plan that leverages state-generated content, best practices, and training materials to raise public JCF collaboration and promote the initiative among prospective partner agencies and organizations.

Additionally, the JCF initiative's mission includes guiding and informing community leaders and local commanders across America on how to establish and sustain collaborative community, state, and regional JCF teams. By building community capacity from the ground up, JCF will enable proactive and effective assistance right where veterans, military members, and their families live.

Chaplain Team

When airmen think of a "chaplain" many think "religion." Ironically, ANG chaplains spend only a fraction of their time providing for the religious needs of airmen.



So, what DO we do?

The Chaplain Corps has three primary functions:

Chaplain Corps members have high-level of confidentiality. Communications made as a "formal act of religion or as a matter of conscience" to either a chaplain or a chaplain assistant while serving in the capacity of spiritual advisor are considered confidential and are not to be shared with third parties. There are no exceptions listed to this rule. As a result, MOST of what the Chaplain Corps provides is counseling, or just a safe place to vent!

Chaplain Corps personnel are also sought out by leaders to provide objective advice on many issues, such as discipline and training.

The Chaplain Corps is responsible for Religious Accommodation Requests for beards, religious head coverings, waivers for vaccines, and other similar waiver requests. Additionally, we advocate for members who have religious needs during deployments - such as special dietary needs - or to be allowed by commanders to attend religious services when needed. Of course, the Chaplains are here to discuss any religious issues or crises a member may be experiencing.

If you would like to speak to a chaplain during the month, our Wing Chaplain, Ch, Lt Col Joseph Friedman is also our full -time chaplain. He can be reached on his duty cell at 303-548-0637. If he is not available, call the Command Post to be connected to another one of our chaplains.

Children of the National Guard and Reserve Deployed or Stateside Activated

Our Military Kids awards up to two \$300 grants per child (ages 3-18) to fund the extracurricular activity of their choice while a parent is deployed or activated stateside with the National Guard or Reserve.

This grant program is made possible solely through the generosity of foundations, corporations, and individual donations.

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

In order for a child to receive an activity grant from Our Military Kids:

- ★ The child is three (3) years of age through 18 AND has not yet graduated from high school.
- For missions of 90-179 days (cumulative within 12 months), each child is eligible for ONE (1) grant up to \$300 for one activity.
- For missions of 180+ days (cumulative within 12 months), each child is eligible for TWO (2) grants up to \$300 each for the same or different activities. Each grant requires a separate application.

UTA Weekend Daycare

GREAT NEWS for our <u>Service Members who are assigned to or working on Buckley SFB during UTA weekends</u>. The Buckley SFB Family Child Care (FCC) program is offering free certified in-home care for children ages 2 weeks to 12 years, in either on-installation housing or in civilian communities for service members on drill weekends. The groups are multi-age and smaller ratios than in the centers.

Free childcare on UTA weekends is available for Single Service Members, Dual Military Service Members, and Service Members who have spouse that works outside the home on drill weekends, they will provide their work schedule.

If the member does not currently use the CDC, they will require a few additional documents such as, spouse proof of employment (if the member has a spouse), an immunization record, and their drill calendar.

Once the child is registered, they are good to go for the year and will only require a phone call or email request for care NLT the Wednesday prior to drill month.
