




## Operation FireGuard's Cutting-Edge Mission Saves Lives and Mitigates Property Damage in U.S.

The Colorado and California National Guard have a new way to save lives and mitigate property damage from wildfires called FireGuard.

Utilizing military-operated satellites and incorporating civilian resources from the National Interagency Fire Center, the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency, and the U.S. Forest Service, service members can detect wildfires, notify authorities, and create products that can be disseminated to fire-fighting networks nationwide.

One of the most critical components in saving lives and property during rapidly escalating fires is being able to make decisions based upon accurate and reliable situational awareness," Director, Colorado Division of Fire Prevention and Control, Mike Morgan said.

FireGuard teams work around the clock to keep a constant eye on rugged, often inaccessible terrain across the country. Analysts then create polygons, a system of drawing on a map to visually represent the movement of fires based on atmospheric, geographical, fuel sources, and topographic

data. These polygons are then disseminated to local authorities in real-time to provide critical information to conduct evacuations and accurately allocate resources in an ever-evolving wildfire.

During the 2021 Marshall Fire in Boulder County, Colorado, that burned more than 6000 acres, high winds prevented normal procedures of manned overflight. The FireGuard team provided the only products available to partners during the initial eight hours of the incident. This facilitated the evacuation of 35,000 people, saving lives in the process.

Morgan stated that without the information provided by Task Force FireGuard, situational awareness at all levels would have been significantly degraded.

“Over the last two years, the FireGuard program has generated more than 47,000 geospatial products on more than 3,500 fires across the United States,” Intelligence Unit Chief, Colorado Division of Fire Prevention and Control, Peter Vidmar said. “This speaks both to the persistent nature of FireGuard support and the scale of the fire problem across the country. With more extreme weather conditions, the increase in Wildland-Urban Interface exposure, and the concept of a fire year instead of a fire season, the early clarity and situational awareness that FireGuard provides helps fill a capability gap.”

The National Guard is uniquely fitted to support the FireGuard mission due to the special training and classification requirement of the job.

“FireGuard has become an integral part of our domestic operations portfolio,” CONG Chief of the Joint Staff U.S. Army Col. William DiProffio said. “Our Task Force is providing early detection of wildfires on a national level, something that hasn’t existed until now.”

The FireGuard team has had many instances of discovering a fire before 911 calls come in and has proven to be more accurate and detailed than the information from ‘eyes on’ reporting.

“While FireGuard is meant to be an additional layer of notification, not a replacement to the 911 system, it is typically the best method of discovering fires in remote areas where humans may not be present,” Morgan said.

FireGuard is a testament to how blending military and civilian resources can improve the lives of community members around the nation by saving lives and preventing loss of property, a core mission of the National Guard.

“It is impactful to know that you can walk outside and see the smoke column of the fire you are providing critical updates for, as was the case for the Marshall fire,” Vidmar said.

According to DiProffio, the National Guard is Always Ready, Always There to respond to requests for support from local first responders who need to react quickly to disasters such as floods, tornadoes, and wildfires especially when they exceed civilian capabilities.

“FireGuard is changing the game when it comes to early fire detection and real-time tracking which has resulted in a much more effective way of preventing loss of life and property in Colorado, California, and around the country,” DiProffio said. 🇺🇸

The Spring application dates will be November 1st to December 9th with the following announcement:

Due to the expanded number of applications and authorizations using the State Tuition Assistance Program, funding authorizations may be revised based on the available funding and the number of applicants. This may cause students to be responsible for any tuition costs not covered by State Tuition Assistance due to a revision in the authorization. Students may request an increase in Federal Tuition Assistance (if eligible) funding to help cover these costs. Please work with your Group UTM if you have Federal Tuition Assistance questions.

In addition, adding courses above the initial State Tuition Assistance authorization is not guaranteed to be approved. (this is not a new disclosure, but has usually been approved previously)

If needed, priority of the date of a completed application file may be used.

**CCAF** is undergoing a huge migration to a new student info system. In the interim, access to the legacy system is unavailable; the pause is estimated to be 3-6 months, with a new system operational NLT March 20230. Information is being disseminated from SAF to appropriate offices whose policies are affected by the pause (such as promotions)--expect info from these offices to follow.

While the pause is in effect, we are unable to access student records (such as web progress reports pulled by members or advisors), submit action requests (such as credit evaluation or graduation submissions), or have student records updated (credits transferred in, classes added to record).

However, members are able to:

--Request a transcript to be sent from CCAF (info will be CAO 28 Sep 22) or have a transcript sent to CCAF (they will safely hold all records and post to student records as soon as operations resume); I'll post the site with transcript info below

--Access AFVEC to submit Federal TA GEM, AU-ABC, Skillbridge, and AF Cool requests

--Reach out for assistance and questions regarding civilian courses and college level testing for applicability, continue to earn credit toward their degree.

We invite you to attend one of the townhall sessions to address the pause of CCAF services and look forward to addressing your concerns.

# Finance goes virtual with launch of AF Comptroller Services Portal (CSP)



CSP is the preferred method going forward to address any pay issues or inquiries going forward. It enables Airmen to submit customer service requests related to Military Pay, Civilian Pay, Travel Pay, Budget, and Accounting Liaison through a simple online process.

With greater transparency, members can now track the progress of their request to FM. Members will automatically receive a notification any time their request has been moved or if the technician requires additional documentation.

Members can upload PII, as the site is secure. Customers will be able to see the status and who has their inquiry each step of the way to include the technician assigned to the request and any elevations required to process the request. Customers will also be able to communicate with the assigned technician throughout the process, upload missing or required information and remain in queue.

The portal is set up to send automated emails notifying customers of updates during the inquiry process.


From your couch to deployment, all you need is CAC access to a computer (VPN is not required), and you can submit your finance-related inquiry through CSP.

To submit a request through CSP, a member must create a profile. You can create your CSP profile via <https://usaf.dps.mil/teams/SAFFMCSP/portal> or stop by the 140th FM office.

We are not eliminating any form of communication with our office. We are just adding this as our primary source for customers for tracking purposes, so they have better oversight of what's going on with their request.



# The Colorado Air National Guard conducts a largescale wartime readiness exercise from Pueblo, Colorado to Scottsbluff, Nebraska

U.S. Air Force Airman assigned to the 140th Wing conduct a post attack reconnaissance (PAR) sweep during Operation Thundercat at Buckley Space Force Base, Aurora, Colo., Sept. 23, 2022. Operation Thundercat is a four day exercise that provides a simulated environment that allows Airmen to practice real-world.

The 140th Wing, Colorado Air National Guard, exercised the ability to execute their wartime mission against an adversary. During this exercise, the inspection teams evaluated the unit under a new inspection method called a Readiness Exercise Validation (REV).

Preparations have been underway for years as the 140th Wing has pioneered and practiced new strategic operation missions such as the Agile Combat Employment (ACE) scenarios. ACE missions employ Multi-Capable Airman (MCA) performing tasks outside of their specific trained fields of expertise to provide a lighter footprint of personnel to deploy aircraft for combat missions in forward operating locations.

Other scenarios, such as contested operations within the cyber domain, and Integrated Combat Turns (ICT) where maintenance personnel can recover and launch an F-16 within minutes, are also practiced and evaluated.

"I am extremely excited to showcase this Wing's ability to execute or mission in a simulated contested environment," said 140<sup>th</sup> Wing Commander, U.S. Air Force Col. Christopher Southard. "Generating combat power is in our DNA. We do it very well and I'm ready to show Air Combat Command exactly how good we are."

The 140th Wing demonstrated the ability to execute the ACE mission from three locations simultaneously in a contested environment, becoming one of the first Wings in the Air National Guard to complete this mission.

"The Inspector General (IG) team devised scenarios based on input from each section that would push airmen to work under pressure with the goal of showcasing their strengths and exposing areas of improvement," said 140th Wing IG Inspection Coordinator, U.S. Air Force Master Sgt. Kaisha Gurtner Hatton. "Our personnel performed exceptionally well in a degraded environment including full chemical gear, while also dealing with situations outside of their specialties such as simulated chemical attacks and ground attacks by opposition forces at one of our ACE locations."

A major part of the preparation was the playbook, that was made available to all members so they would be as prepared as possible heading into this exercise. The commander and the IG team stressed the importance of safety, having a positive attitude, and leadership/followership as key elements in success.

"For our unit to not have a full-scale readiness exercise in over a decade, this was a huge success, and a needed steppingstone as future exercises will increase the stressors as we move towards operating in further contested environments," said Master Sgt. Gurtner Hatton.

The REV resulted in a valid-yes rating across four graded areas, being scope, scale, rigor, and relevance (S2R2) from the Air Combat Command inspection team. This is a huge milestone for the 140th Wing, which showcases our ability to support emerging needs and better prepares us for Great Power Conflict. Continued readiness exercises testing our capabilities allows for an even greater and more effective fighting force. 🇺🇸

There are NO allocations for each branch of service – so spouses will be enrolled on a first come first serve basis. 
